### Our Honor Code

Episcopal Collegiate School's Honor Code promotes an atmosphere of integrity. Trust has formed the foundation of the Episcopal Collegiate community since our inception in 2003, and that trust is built on the expectation that each member of the community strives to live with honor. At the beginning of each school year, students and faculty sign the Episcopal Collegiate School Honor Pledge:

*I pledge that I will uphold the Honor Code with my mind, body, and spirit, and that I have neither given nor received inappropriate or unauthorized assistance on academic work, and that I will respect the personal property of all people.*

### Our Faculty

There are 103 full-time faculty with 50% holding advanced degrees. Students learn in an intimate environment with a student-faculty ratio of 8:1 and average class size of 13.

### Standard Course Load

Ninth and tenth grade students take six to seven courses per semester. Eleventh and twelfth grade students take five to six courses per semester. A minimum of four of the six must be taken in the core subject areas: English, math, history, science, and world languages.

## AP® Eligibility

When considering student requests for advanced courses, the School typically includes the following factors in an effort to make sure that each student is appropriately challenged:

- a demonstrated interest in the subject area
- performance in prerequisite and/or comparable courses (typically B+ or higher)
- standardized test scores, when available and appropriate for the course being considered
- history of completing work consistently and on time
- a demonstrated willingness to seek extra help when needed
- the anticipated workload of the overall requested schedule of academic courses, relative to the current year
- intended area(s) of study in college or other post-graduation plans
- time for participation in school activities outside of coursework, including athletics, fine arts, clubs, and/or service

## Additional AP® Notes

A student cannot take more than 5 AP classes in a given year.

Students do not report AP scores until matriculation unless required for admission.

## Interruptions to School Spring 2020

In mid-March 2020, Episcopal Collegiate School turned to virtual learning for all grades. Students attended all classes online synchronously. Spring semester grades were calculated using our standard grading scale, with third and fourth quarters weighted equally.

All athletic and extracurricular activities were halted for the semester, returning in mid-summer for athletic practices.

## 2020-2021

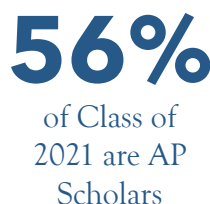
All classes were initially taught in the hybrid model, with students choosing between in-person and online learning.

One and a half days of classes were missed in early September due to a tropical storm and lightning strike that damaged the Upper School building. All classes were moved online for a few weeks until temporary classroom space became available on-campus. For the spring semester, classes were again hybrid.

## 2021-2022

With 100% of the faculty and over 95% of the eligible student body vaccinated, all classes have returned to in-person learning (in masks). Athletic teams continue to compete, and all clubs and other organizations have resumed. College representatives have the option of meeting with juniors and seniors virtually or in-person (vaccination required).

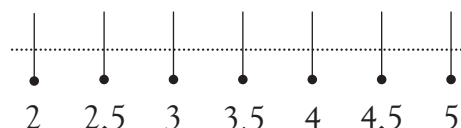

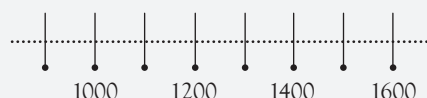


## SAT® SCORES

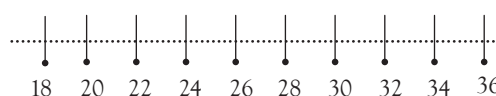


## ACT® SCORES
