## Co-Curricular News - Science

## Blackmon Science Lab News

Life in the lab has definitely gotten busy over the past few weeks! Here's a look at what we've been up to:

Third graders successfully raised their mealworms from larvae to pupa to beetle and had a great time setting up their individual habitats and watching the transformations take place. We are currently building a rainforest outside the lab and studying animals in conjunction with the third grade language arts domain. Once the rainforest is completed, it will stay up for several weeks as third graders transition from life science to earth science.

Fourth graders have been busy growing Wisconsin Fast Plants and yes- they do grow fast! We've recorded our plant growth, watched new leaves appear, identified the parts of the flowers, and used "bee sticks" to cross pollinate our plants so they can produce seed pods. Our Bess Beetles arrived last week, so fourth graders will examine the structures of the beetles. Later we conduct a "penny pull" investigation to see how much weight the beetles can pull in relationship to the weight of the individual beetles and explore why this strength is helpful in the beetles' environment.

Fifth graders turned in their fabulous "Mr./Mrs. Bones" projects and those are now on display in the hallway. The creativity and work the students put into these always amazes me and this year is absolutely fantastic! In class, we are finished with the skeletal and circulatory systems and starting the respiratory system, digestive system, and then tying all these together to show how each system depends on the other to keep the body working properly. Lots of great projects and lively conversations in class make our human body study so much fun!

Middle School A Note from Dr. McCormick

Dear Parents,

As some of you may have heard, we had an amazing team-building experience packing meals for Tacos4Life last Friday at the Little Rock Convention Center. Together with a couple of other businesses and home school groups, we packed 59,000 meals in approximately one and one-half hours of work, which is enough to feed one meal a day to 162 children for a year! In writing classes, a number of students reflected on the experience. Here are a few of these reflections:

Virginia B, sixth grade: On Friday my school and I went to the state convention center to package rice, soy, veggies, and vitamins to feed the hungry. We went so we could help people in need and do community service. When I was told about it I thought we were going to Tacos 4 Life and make food for people, but really we packed food. The most fun part was packing at the stations, I got to hold the bags and put the food in, but at the same time it was challenging making sure I put the right amount of food in the bag. What surprised me is that we packed 272 boxes and fed 162 children for a year, which is amazing. I was kind of familiar with it because with my 6th graders at my church we went to the food bank and packed potatoes. Overall I think everyone should do this; it is a great experience.

Clark B, sixth grade: On Friday, October 4th, I and the entire middle school body went to the convention center to pack food for people all over the world. Our trip started with the sixth graders getting on a bus and screaming at the top of our lungs until we got to the convention center. When we got there we put on hairnets and listened to the FMSC (Feed My Starving Children) representative do his speech about starving children and how to pack the rice. After he finished his speech, we got divided up and we went to our stations to
start packing rice, vitamins, soy, and veggies into bags for two hours. Immediately after getting to the station, I found that the boxing area required the most organization, so I knew that was going to be my job. I quickly realized that it was a lot more fun than I thought it would be. Finally, two hours later the FMSC representative said over the microphone that the packing experience was over, and we got back on the bus knowing that we had done a great thing for those 162 kids that would have food for a year. I would totally recommend this. It was a great experience and I would do it again.

Alex S, sixth grade: Last Friday my school and I took a trip down to the state convention center to help package meals for kids across the world who do not have a lot of food. Something that surprised me was that we were actually having fun while we were working. We were making jokes and laughing. We would laugh when one of us made a big mess or when we screamed at the top of our lungs for more materials. Something that was challenging was making sure that the weight of the bags was to Tacos4Life's expectations. Another thing that was challenging was scooping the vitamins out of the box. From the long scoopers to the tiny grains, it took a lot of strength to scoop them out. I would definitely recommend this experience to people who love to help their community and the world around them.
