Rooted in the Episcopal tradition and affirming people of all faiths, Episcopal Collegiate strives to develop in its students a respect for all persons, a reverence of God, and a sense of moral responsibility.

Our Faculty

There are 109 full-time faculty with 66% holding advanced degrees. Students learn in an intimate environment with a student-faculty ratio of 8:1 and average class size of 13.

Interruptions to Learning and School Life

In mid-March, Episcopal Collegiate School turned to virtual learning for all grade levels. Upper School students continued to attend their regularly scheduled classes synchronously through Google Meet daily and to turn in assignments online. Because we are a one-to-one

laptop school, only occasional connectivity issues and home-life adjustments created any problems. Spring semester grades were calculated using our standard grading scale with third and fourth quarters weighted equally.

Athletics and extracurricular organizations were halted at that time. Athletic practices resumed in mid-summer, and all fall sports were allowed by state guidelines to begin competitions again by late August. Extracurricular organizations still are paused.

Students and faculty began the 2020-21 school year with the individual choice of in-person or virtual classes. Approximately 12 percent of Upper School students chose to take classes virtually alongside their in-person peers.

In August, Tropical Storm Laura caused school to be suspended for half a day, due to high winds and heavy rain. The following Saturday afternoon, lightning struck the Upper School building, causing significant water and smoke damage to the second floor. After a day-and-a-half closure, all Upper School students resumed classes online following the regular schedule. Construction will continue on the building through the fall. The choice of in-person learning, hopefully, will begin again by the end of September.

2. Standardized Testing of 85th percentile or higher
3. Current teacher approval.

A student cannot take more than 5 AP classes in a given year.

Students do not report AP scores until matriculation unless required for admission.

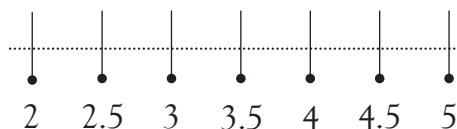
